Solo-user annual subscription—password access, one profile only \$195

Site annual subscription for one user at a time, unlimited number of total users and profiles \$325

Additional concurrent users

Annual fee for 2 or more concurrent users

2-9 concurrent users \$55 per additional user

10-19 concurrent users \$50 per additional user

20+ concurrent users \$45 per additional user

Example: 5 total users, but only 3 concurrent users = \$435 (\$325 base price + 2x \$55)
