ACOC thanks the Music Working Group for this proposal and appreciates the effort to make the instructions regarding numbering for parts of a musical work clearer and more logical.

However, ACOC does not agree to standardising the practice of abbreviating Number (or its equivalent in another language). We are concerned that standardising the use of abbreviations contradicts a key aim of RDA to reduce the use of abbreviations.

However, we acknowledge that in many cases, the designator Number is abbreviated in resources embodying parts of musical works, or in reference sources. For this reason, perhaps the revised instructions could reflect this, rather than simply allow for standardised use of abbreviations.
