

### Boston Spa Renewed

Our Boston Spa site is undergoing a major redevelopment 2021-2025

- Main cataloguing/metadata areas are to be demolished or refurbished starting in early 2022
- Currently planning moves to alternative on site accommodation
- Loss of large training rooms
- Hybrid work patterns are essential as not all staff can be accommodated on site during the redevelopment









### Implementation project

We are currently using the "original" RDA Toolkit, implemented in 2013

The implementation of the official Toolkit was originally expected to take place this year.

Implementation won't start earlier than July 2022

Currently inducting/training Documentation & Training WG members


Meeting with stakeholders to discuss CIP, Outsourcing, Legal Deposit

Priority to transfer existing RDA users to Official Toolkit

Further work to revise training for new cataloguers

Minimise impact on cataloguers and other stakeholders

Legal deposit Libraries

Cataloguing in Publication Agent (BDS) and other suppliers

"Light touch" DOES NOT apply to cataloguing managers, trainers or other colleagues working on documentation for the Official Toolkit

### "Light touch" implementation means:



We do not anticipate any disruption to services arising from implementation of the official Toolkit.

We will continue to catalogue in MARC 21

- We will review impact of any MARC developments on productivity
- URIs and identifiers in our bibliographic data
  - ISNI in subfield \$1 name headings [soon]
    - in e-book records received from publishers and aggregators
    - in CIP records received from CIP Agent BDS
    - as a result of legacy matching
  - RDA relationship identifiers in \$4 [2022]

Products are mainly documentation:


- Application profiles (MARC 21)

 We have a new "Learning Hub" which enables us to deliver courses to internal and external audiences.

# Collaboration: Library of Congress and Program for Cooperative Cataloguing

LC leading a project to update PCC metadata documentation to align with RDA Official Toolkit



British Library is among the PCC members contributing to the work

Current institutional guidelines are being aggregated using a standard template for specific elements.

Terminology is being standardized and examples are being provided to support MARC and BIBFRAME users.

#### Internationalization of RDA

- Support for different cataloguing traditions
- Anglo-American legacy practices relocated to Community resources
- Maintained/developed by communities NOT RSC

#### **Community resources**

This area of RDA toolkit holds content that conforms to the RDA standard but is specific to language or specialist communities rather than international in scope.

Community resources is subarranged into two areas:

- Community refinements 1 provides additional guidance and instructions for existing RDA elements that are applicable to specific communities
- Community vocabularies 1 provides controlled terms for use as values of specific RDA elements using specialized community-based vocabularies or language-based vocabularies.






## Learning Hub

Transformation boundaries - change of

- · scope or editorial policy
- genre or literary form
- target audience
- style

A change in the value of an element that is common to the parts issues or iterations of a diachronic work  $\underline{may}$  indicate a change in the plan for the work

A plan for change of content may affect some, but not all expressions or manifestations. In which case different plans will exist which may change independently in future.

For example, the content of a digital newspaper may diverged substantially from its print counterpart.

Therefore a diachronic work is realised by 1 expression and embodied in 1 manifestation = **WEM lock**
