Subject: Formal response to RSC/NARDAC/2025/4, Scope note for Corporate Body

The RDA Examples Editor thanks NARDAC for this proposal. I appreciate NARDAC's point that the LRM enumerates many different examples of collective agent, which also fall under the RDA Corporate Body entity. Many of the examples are not obviously corporate bodies to all RDA users (e.g., spacecraft), and I believe the community of RDA users would appreciate the extra guidance that a scope note and glossary definition would provide.

Although the scope of Collective Agent in RDA could be revised instead, I prefer the revisions as laid out in NARDAC's proposal. As an entity supertype, Collective Agent is broader than Corporate Body by design, and it would be misleading to add a long list of specific examples to the scope of Collective Agent if the examples related to only one subtype (Corporate Body) and not the other subtype (Family).

Recommendation 1: Under Entities > Corporate Body revise the definition and scope by adding a scope note.
